 - Michael Baker International






Project Summary

- This project will be completed through three separate tasks:
 - Existing Conditions Assessment-assess and evaluate existing hydraulic infrastructure and conduct Stakeholder meeting.
 - Vulnerability Assessment-assess medium and long term vulnerability of Port Penn.
 - Mitigation Options, Resiliency Measures, and Summary of Findings-develop mitigation option conduct a public workshop to obtain Stakeholder 1673



Project Summary

- Vulnerability Assessment Scenarios:
 - 15-year (2030) and 30-year (2045) planning horizon
 - High tide, 10-year, and 100-year storm events
 - Sea Level Rise projections from 2012 DNREC Report
 - Chose high scenario: +0.66 ft. by 2030, +1.31 ft. by 2045
